Call for a Tenure Track Faculty Position in Environmental Biotechnology

The Faculty of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology invites applicants for a tenure track position in the Division of Environmental, Water and Agricultural Engineering with expertise in Environmental Biotechnology.

The Division of Environmental, Water and Agricultural Engineering is committed to excellence in teaching and interdisciplinary research related to the open and the urban environment, with special emphasis on systems engineering. Both teaching and research are aimed at providing the knowledge base, innovation and human capital needed to shape an efficient, safe, and sustainable environment to support economic growth and quality of life of the citizens.

The Water and Wastewater Engineering and Open Environment groups within the Division cover research and teaching in the fields of advanced water/wastewater treatment and reuse, water and soil chemistry, environmental microbiology/biotechnology, soil conservation, surface and subsurface hydrology and transport phenomena, soil-plant-atmosphere interactions.

The positions are open to all academic levels with priority to young applicants and background in Environmental Biotechnology/Microbial Ecology/Molecular Biology. Priority fields include bioremediation processes, biological mechanisms in advanced wastewater treatment and soil reclamation, environmental microbiology/microbial ecology.

Applicants should have a basic knowledge of the Hebrew language and have a demonstrated leadership and commitment to teaching and research in the academic environment.
